## **Answer key**

- 1 Juneteenth is a combination of 'June' and 'nineteenth', the day on which enslaved people in Texas learned they were free.
- **2** Juneteenth has been celebrated since 1865, so that's 158 years in 2023.
- **3** Major General Gordon Granger read General Order number 3
- 4 The 2.5 miles she walks stand for the 2.5 years between the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863 and Juneteenth in 1865.
- 5 The colours (red, white, and blue) represent the colours of the American flag and that all enslaved people and their children are American.
  The curved line represents a new horizon.
  The star represents Texas, but also the freedom of Black people in America.
  The starburst represents a new beginning for all African Americans.
- 7a Keti Koti means 'Broken Chains' and it is the day the end of slavery in Suriname is celebrated and remembered. Keti Koti is celebrated on the 1st of July.
- **7b** On both days, the end of slavery is celebrated and remembered. Juneteenth is a national holiday. Keti Koti is a national holiday in Suriname, but not in the Netherlands. Many people want it to become a national holiday here too.
